

THE GOOD SHEPHERD FOUNDATION CLINIC 2020 SUMMARY REPORT

Following is a summary of what we have accomplished during 2020 at the clinic, along with a list of the most frequent pathologies that we have seen in our patients and treated during the year.

As you know, our goal is to provide quality medical services, which previously did not exist, in Chevreau Lombard and the surrounding areas, located in the north of Haiti. This community's population lives on the margins of the Haitian society, where resources are scarce, and people experience the difficulties of obtaining the necessities of life.

This is a community that lacks potable water, adequate food supplies, electrical service, opportunities for a good education, and prior to our arrival, even the most basic medical assistance.

We have been working in this community for many years, holding a clinic every three weeks, where we see patients of all ages with chronic diseases and various acute conditions. Although we do not always have the means and materials to respond to every condition we encounter, we always do what we can.

For the end of the year, I am presenting you with a summary of the diseases and conditions that we saw most frequently in our patients in this community:

- hypertension
- iron poor anemia
- bacterial dermatitis
- diabetes
- diarrhea
- reflux
- chronic gastritis
- fever
- Asthma
- Urinary and Vaginal infections

Despite the socioeconomic conditions of the country and the extreme lack of security experienced during 2020, we were able to help many of the people with the above-mentioned problems. Without The Good Shepherd Foundation and its donors, this would not have been possible.
